#### Just to remind everyone our local Wine Club is still running.

#### **Parish Council**

Edited notes from the Parish Council meetings held on **November 28<sup>th</sup> 2022** and **January 30<sup>th</sup> 2023** in the Village Hall. Full minutes of council meetings are posted on the Village Notice Boards and on the Parish Council website. If anyone would like more on any matter, please contact the Clerk, Ken Power.

November 28<sup>th</sup> 2022 meeting: The meeting was attended by 6 councillors and 2 members of the public.

**Neighbourhood noise issue**: Neighbours continue to raise the issue regarding noise from William Blake House. Details will be shared with WBH management and invite them to attend the March meeting to review progress. It was noted that these issues take time to address, but it was felt that this time frame should allow for significant improvement.

**Finance Matters**: Accounts 2021/22 to-date and budget performance to date were reviewed and approved. It was noted that a claim for £286 of VAT will be submitted to HMRC.

**Payments** were approved for CGM (Churchyard and Millennium Field mowing), Clerk's salary and expenses, NPower (electricity supply for street lights)

**Planning Matters:** Application WNS/2022/1903/FUL: Crown Cottage, 2A Helmdon Road, Weston. Single storey rear extension. - Supported.

Self-build Exception Sites - The Council agreed its responses to a survey from NCALC

**Castle Mound**: The Council is continuing to work with Historic England to set up a Management Agreement whereby HE will financially support work needed to maintain and protect the site. It was agreed that an information board should be purchased and set up on The Green to explain the site's historical importance.

Millennium Field - It will be made clear to the school that they are free to make use of the field without payment.

**Annual Meeting 2023** - It was agreed that he date of the Annual Meeting should be moved to Monday 15<sup>th</sup> May

**Resignation** - Cllr. Hillman announced her decision to resign from the Parish Council as the family are moving away from the village. The Chairman thanked her for her service to the Council. A Casual Vacancy Notice will be published and the Council will look for a replacement.

**Broadband complaint**- The council had received a complaint from a resident regarding the routing of the fibre-optic cables without permission. The Chairman will clarify the Council's responsibilities regarding the Fibre-to-the premises project.

**January 30<sup>th</sup> 2023 meeting**: The meeting was attended by 5 councillors.

**Finance Matters**: Accounts 2021/22 to-date and budget performance to date were reviewed and approved. It was noted that the overdue claim of VAT (now approximately £500) will be claimed before the end of the financial year.

**Budget & Precept:** Analysis of current year's income and expenditure was discussed and the proposal was updated to allow for additional funds to allow for the upkeep of Castle Mound and other unexpected costs. A precept request of £8000 was agreed for the new financial year..

**Payments** were approved for Clerk's salary and expenses, NCALC, NPower (electricity supply for street lights), 2Commune (website support and licence fee), Information lectern for Castle Mound

**Casual Vacancy**: The council has a vacancy because of the resignation of Cllr. Moira Hillman who has left the area. Two candidates had expressed an interest in becoming a Councillor. After a ballot, the Councillors agreed to invite Penny Spademan to join the Council.

**Planning Matters**: Application WNS/2023/0034/FUL: 29, High Street, Weston Double storey side extension and double garage with office above. - Supported

**Millennium Field** - St. Loys School has responded very positively to the Council's commitment to allowing the school to use the Millennium Field free of charge. The Council is committed to maintaining the field and keeping it available for use by members of the community

**Castle Mound -** Historic England has confirmed it will contribute to the cost of tree work currently required, and future ground-cover control in 2023 and 2024. A Management Agreement is being drawn up by H.E. It was noted that work should not start until the Management Agreement is signed. An information lectern explaining the historical importance of the site, sponsored by John & Iris Gregory, will be installed on The Green.

**Marquee** - The marquee was recently damaged during use in bad weather and being put away while wet. In future the marquee will only be available to borrow or hire from March to October when weather is less extreme. Repairs will be arranged.

**Coronation Weekend** - Arrangements for events for the Coronation weekend were discussed. The Council is committed to supporting local events. Cllr. Smith offered to coordinate discussions with local organisations.

#### **RECIPES**

#### **Guinness Cake**

A cake baked in a tin approximately 7" (180mm) in size

#### **Ingredients:**

4oz (125g) margarine, 6oz (150g) brown sugar, 8oz (250g) plain flour, ¼ teaspoon salt, 2 eggs – beaten, ¼ pint Guinness, 1 level teaspoon bicarbonate of soda 2 level teaspoons mixed spice Grated rind of ½ lemon 4oz (125g) currants, 2oz (65g) sultanas 3oz (94g) raisins, 2oz (65g) mixed peel

#### Method:

Cream fat and sugar together. Sift flour & salt.

Gradually add the flour & beaten eggs alternately to the creamed fat, beating well between additions.

Pour warmed Guinness on to the bicarbonate of soda and add to the flour & fat. Stir in the mixed spice, lemon rind and prepared fruit.

Place mixture in prepared 7" cake tin and bake in the oven on  $170^{\circ}$ C, gas mark 3 – 4 for approximately  $1\frac{1}{2}$  - 2 hours
