


Lois Weedon and Weston Newsletter

Parish Council

Edited notes from the Parish Council meeting held on **March 27th 2023** in the Village Hall. Full minutes of council meetings are posted on the Village Notice Boards and on the Parish Council website. If anyone would like more on any matter, please contact the Clerk, Ken Power. The meeting was attended by 5 councillors, 5 members of the public and 3 representatives from William Blake House

New Councillor: The Chairman welcomed the new Councillor, Penny Spademen, to the Council.

William Blake House: The representatives of William Blake House outlined a large number of measures that have been, or will be, taken to reduce disturbance to neighbours. These were well received by the Councillors and the local residents present, and the Chairman thanked them for the work they have done and are continuing to do.

Contact details for the CEO and the Operations Manager were shared and published (by agreement) in the minutes As the Summer is the most challenging time for this issue it was agreed that the situation would be reviewed again at the Parish Council meeting in July

Finance Matters: Accounts 2022/23 to-date and budget performance to date were reviewed and approved. It was noted that a claim for £505 of VAT will be submitted to HMRC.

Payments were approved for hire of Village Hall and Clerk's salary and expenses, were reviewed and approved. **Planning Matters:** the following applications were reviewed:

Application WNS/2023/0276/FUL: 18, High Street, Weston NN12 8PU. Demolition of existing conservatory and replace with rear single storey extension. Council response: Support

Application WNS/2023/0243/FUL. Lois Weedon House, Wappenham Road, Weedon Lois NN12 8PJ. Installation of 162 solar panels in the field east of The Lodge. Council Response: Support, but there is a need to minimise the visual impact from the road. This will be shared as a comment

Application WNS/2023/0452/FUL. Land south of Manor Farm Cottages, Plumpton Road, Plumpton NN12 8SF. Change of use of land from agricultural to residential to facilitate installation of sewage treatment plant. Council response: Support.

Correspondence: Letter from E.ON concerning new charges for streetlamp maintenance.

Parish Assets Register and Risk Analysis: The up-dated Asset Register and the current Risk Analysis were reviewed and approved. Cllr. Smith is arranging for damage to the marquee to be repaired.

Castle Mound: The tree work necessary to protect the site and make it safe for users and neighbouring property has started. A contribution request has been submitted to Historic England. The Green will be put back into good condition when the work is completed.

AOB: It was asked to report the very poor condition of Astwell Road and also the damage to the Milthorpe road name sign. Cllr Smith has agreed to coordinate the activities over the Coronation Week-end

Just to remind everyone our local Wine Club is still running.

We are keen to see old faces returning as well as new people and those new to the area that may not be aware of the wine club.

We meet every month at a variety of local venues. It is informal and sociable.

We usually have 8 or 9 different wines to taste together with a small quantity of simple food to go with the wines.

The evenings are presented usually by members but occasionally external presenters are used.

There is always a mix of Red and White wines.

The themes for the evening are chosen by the presenters. This can often be wines from a particular country or region or comparing old world / new world varieties. Occasionally we have had fortified wines (Sherry and Port) or Gin, Cider or Beer.

Annual Membership is £15 then £10 a night or non-members £13 a night (the sum is occasionally higher if wines from a more expensive area are used).

The evenings are suitable for people who just like wine as well as anyone with a more academic interest!
